

PE / Sport Homework

Year 10 and 11 GCSE PE GCSE PE

Homework will be set via Edulink once a week. The homework set by PE staff will utilise online learning platforms such as Kerboodle, where students have full access to their own GCSE PE textbook and The Everlearner website where students may be asked to make notes from specific videos and then complete online tests and checkpoints. All work done on these elearning platforms can be monitored by PE staff. Some homework will be completed in PE exercise books and this should be completed to a high standard. At certain times in the academic year PE homework will also focus on the written coursework component and students will be expected to meet the deadlines for submission for this key element of the course. In all years, as we approach key examinations, all PE students will be required to revise content using a variety of revision techniques and complete past papers.

Sport

The coursework nature of the OCR Sport course is such that weekly homework will focus on completion of coursework tasks. Students have access to all their coursework via Google Drive and the weekly expectation will be that students continue to improve and develop their work to achieve higher grades. In the summer of Year 10 all students will be required to revise ready for their Contemporary Issues Exam and this will be done through a variety of revision techniques and completion of past papers.

Year 12 and 13 A Level PE A Level PE

Homework will be set once a week by each member of the A Level PE teaching team (Mr Haworth, Mrs Wilson, Mr Wilson). The homework set by PE staff will vary between online learning platforms such as The Everlearner website, where students may be asked to make notes from specific videos and complete online tests and past papers, extended answer homeworks related to the lesson content. All written homeworks will be completed in PE exercise books and this should be done to a high standard. At certain times in the academic year PE homework will also focus on the written coursework component and students will be expected to meet the deadlines for submission for this key element of the course. In all years, as we approach key examinations, all A Level PE students will be required to revise content using a variety of revision techniques and complete past papers. It will also be an expectation that students explore key concepts in their independent study and look to expand their knowledge by reading PE / Sport journals, articles, newspapers and webpages.

Sport OCR

Sport homework is crucial in ensuring all students meet or exceed their target grade. The majority of both single and triple sport is coursework and all students are required to complete coursework for the specific deadline. Weekly homework and independent study time must be dedicated to improving coursework tasks. All students have access to their own Google Drive sport folder. Within this folder are all

unit outlines, unit requirements and tips for successful completion. In January and May students will be sitting exam units and revision will take priority over coursework at this stage for all homework.
